**Luke 10:1-2, 17-20** After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. <sup>2</sup> He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. <sup>17</sup> The seventy-two returned with joy and said, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name." <sup>18</sup> He replied, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. <sup>19</sup> I have given you authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you. <sup>20</sup> However, do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

1. Satan despises evangelism.

2. Satan seeks to sabotage the work of evangelism.
  - Blinding the minds of unbelievers (2 Corinthians 4:4)
  - Distorting the message of the gospel (Galatians 1:6-8)
  - Distracting the focus of the believer (Mark 16:15)
  
3. Satan is no match for a faithful witness who boldly shares the gospel of Christ.
  - Beyond the 12 (Philemon 1:6)
  - The matter of authority (Matthew 28:18-19)
  - Heavenly delight (Proverbs 11:30; Daniel 12:3)
